City, "Apparently a great deal of pressure as being put on the Compiroller to use there funds to buw Hig MAC bonds." Emery explained. "This could be disastrous for the State and for every state tarmaguer."

The Livonia Legislator, who is Deputy Minority Leader in the Assembly, explained that banks and investment houses have shunaned the MAC bonds and that the Comptroller has resisted pressure in the past to pump pension money into the bonds because the funds would gain no tax advantages.




