Following their wedding trip, they will reside at 241 1/2 Jefferson Street, Wellsville, New York.

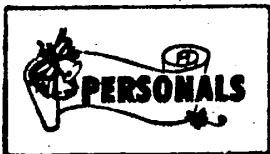
