Annual Missionary Convention At C & M A Church Sept. 14 - 17

A young American missionary-nurse, who has spent the past four years in one of the South Pacific's most primitive nations, will come here to take part in a church missionary conference.

She is Miss Lorna M. Farnsworth home for a year's furlough after completing her first term of service and ministry in Irian Jaya formerly New Guinea. She accepted the overseas assignment with The Christian and Missionary Alliance in 1971 and has found unlimited opportunities for serving the many sick and ailing people of the isolated Moni tribes within the rugged mountain interior.

She will describe many of her unusual experiences in the land of stone-age culture when she speaks during the annual missionary convention in the Christian & Missionary Alliance Church, located on Rochambeau Ave. Dates of the special mission emphasis will be September 14 - 17, with the public invited to all sessions beginning at 7:30 p. m. daily, and at 11:00 a. m., and 7:30 p. m. on Sunday.

A resident of Norwood, N. Y. Miss Farnsworth is a graduate of the Good Samaritan School of Nursing in Watertown, N. Y., and of Nyack, N. Y.

Reporting on her first term of ministry, she refers to the intensity of study in the Moni language, even while supervising and carrying on the necessary medical work among the tribal people.

"I was really helped in my language study, particularly word meanings that will be useful to me in my medical work, by the contacts with the Moni patients I have taken care of in the hospital," she explains. "I have also learned many things about medical treatment in the tropical area, particularly with diseases that are found only in the tropics."

She will also tell of the opportunities to present the Christian gospel to the Moni people, most of whom live in fear of evil spirits.

The growing impact of the Christian gospel in the metropolitan areas of the country of Brazil in South America will be described here by a young American missionary and teacher during a church missionary conference.

He is the Rev. Darrell J. Smith, of Pittsburgh, Pa., who with his wife Janalce, of Orrville, Ohio, accepted the overseas assignment from the Christian and Missionary Alliance in 1970.

He will be among the guest speakers during the annual missionary convention in the Andover Christian & Missionary Alliance Church on Rochambeau Ave. September 14 - 17.

Mr. and Mrs. Smith engaged in study of the Portuguese language early in their first term of service, and were then transferred by the mission to live in the modern city of Curitiba, which has a population of about 700,000. A feature city is its extensive industrial park which has attracted business and industry representing many of the leading companies in North America and Europe.

Ministering in cooperation with the national Alliance church body in Brazil, the Smiths first assisted a congregation in the suburbs of Curitiba. Then, they were asked to initiate the development of a new church group directly within the heart of the downtown area of the city and this effort was begun in a suitable rented room in an office building.

The growth of the nucleus group soon demanded another location, and before the end of their first four-year term in Brazil, the Smiths moved the location of the congregation in a nine-room building situated in the center of the city and at the gateway of one of the city's parks.

Along with the church-planting ministry, Mr. Smith has taught Old and New Testament History and History of the Christian Church in the Alliance Bible Training Program for development of national pastors for the Alliance Churches in Brazil.
