The Clergy Review

The Purpose of Education

Another article in the Andover News explain that at the organization meeting of the Andover Clergy Association, it was decided with the cooperation of the Andover News to have this "Clergy Review" with each minister of the community to contribute an article on a rotating basis. Someone suggested that we do this alphabetically. I tried to reverse the alphabet so Father Zmoyinski would begin the series but no such luck. It is nice to know that our group runs from "A" to "Z" and probably in more ways than the spelling of our last names.

An idea was put forth that since this is the time students are returning to Schools and Colleges, it would be appropriate for this first article to say something about Education. The Scripture text as a basis for discussing this with you is the familiar one, "And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favour with God and man." (St. Luke 2:52). The last portion of that phrase, "in favor with God and man", indicates that wisdom is more than head knowledge. The purpose of education is to enable us to be "in favor with God and man" and thus to be persons both of stature and wisdom.

In our still affluent and materialistic age with its computerized technology we have laid great emphasis on the need to be educated for a job—to have a saleable skill. In the process we may have forgotten that it is one thing to make a living, but quite another to make or to have a life worth the living. To be able to contribute into the labor market and help maintain a sound economy, and for the individual to provide for his and his family's basic material needs is a responsibility in our society. The acceptance of that responsibility is a part of a self-fulfilling life. But it is only a part.

We forget that most of our private universities were started by Christian Churches and other religious groups for the express purpose of providing a liberal education—the word "liberal" meaning "to liberate". Education is one of the means by which God in his love for men seeks to set us free from some of our ignorance, some of our built-in prejudices, our inordinate fears and superstitions so we can more effectively contribute to the betterment of all mankind. In our very individualistic society of today this high-

purpose has been grossly neglected.

To those young people returning to our schools and colleges, I recommend that you not only develop your abilities and talents but that you also search out those kinds of experiences and relationships which will deepen your understanding of yourself and the needs, hopes and aspirations of others in the world about you. There is not one of you whose unique and important contribution isn't needed to help move the world a little in the direction of a world in which all men can have a life that is really worth the living; a world in which all persons can experience peace, dignity and brotherhood and, above all, true love.
