In the Meat Department, Ground Beef is down to 89c per pound. Rath Pork Sausage Rolls are \$1.09 a lb.; Braunschweiger is 69c a lb. and sliced Beef Liver is 69c a lb. In the Grocery Department, Green Giant Niblets Corn is 29c for a 12-oz. can; Red & White Tomato Soup is 15c for a 10 3/4-oz. can; and Del Haven Applesauce is 19c for a 1 lb. can.

In the Produce Department, Cabbage is 10c a lb.; mushrooms 89c a lb.; and large Green Peppers are 3 for 25c.
