Well Folks, as we had previously predicted, sugar prices are still dropping as well as the price of beef with the arrival of the Fall season. Also, with an estimated 20% less in the hog production, the price of Pork will continue to rise until the supply meets the demand.

And, believe it or not, we received the largest shipment of canning supplies of the season even tho it might be a little late for many of our customers.

Our Specials in the Meat Department this week are: Ground Chuck at 89c per lb.; Chuck Roast at 89c; Chuck Steaks at 99c; semi-boneless Chuck Roast at \$1.09, and boneless Chuck Roast at \$1.29. Frying Chicken Breast and Leg Quarters are 69c a pound; and Red and White Luncheon Meats are 99c per pound.

In the Produce line California Pascal Celery is 39c a bunch; Carrots are 2 lbs. for 29c; home-grown Cabbage, 10c a lb.; Red Tokay Grapes 29c a lb. and Honey Dew Melons are 69c each.
