## News That's Print To Fit

What do you know? Yep, we were right about the rain-fall last week! Only we here in Allegany

week! Only we here in Allegany were lucky. Thursday, we recorded .95 inches of rain for the day before, (Sept. 24th) and then during the day and evening it was raining at the rate of ½ of an inch every six hours so that by Friday morning we had another 1.95 inches of rain recorded — and then it stopped! Thus between 9 a. m., Wcd., Sept. 24th and 9 a. m. Friday. Sept. 26th. we had 2.85 inches of rain, rain.
