

School Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular meeting of the Board of Education of Andover Central School was held in order by Francis Horan. The following members were present: Carl Atwell, William Walker, Mary K. Slade, Francis Horan. Also present was Curville E. Jordan, Dist. Principal.

The minutes of the September regular meeting were read for approval. Carl Atwell made the motion to accept these as read and Francis Horan seconded the motion. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

The Clerk's and District Treasurer's reports were read for comparison and approval. These reports were moved for approval by Mary K. Slade and seconded by Carl Atwell. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

The General Fund Warrant was presented for approval. Amount — \$23,990.68. William Walker made the motion and it was seconded by Francis Horan. Carried by 4 votes of yes.

Cafeteria bill for the month of September totaled \$3,501.03. Carl Atwell made the motion to pay these. Francis Horan seconded the motion. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Payrolls for the month of September totaled \$43,045.19. Mary K. Slade made the motion to approve the payment of these. Carl Atwell seconded the motion. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

The Board of Education voted to accept the BOCES Services contract for the 1976-77 school year. Walker made the motion and Atwell seconded the motion. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

The Board approved the Tax Levy change submitted by the County Tax Assessor-Director. Copy attached to these minutes. Horan made the motion and Atwell seconded the motion. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

We have received — as of October 4, 1975 — three copies of the Commissioner's bond certificate for the School Board.

The Audit Report of Edward T. ... Carl Atwell made the motion that this audit be approved and Horan seconded the motion. Motion passed by 4 votes of yes.

Resolution passed to accept warrants on New School Bus Garage for a total of \$2,140.24. Carl Atwell made the motion and Francis Horan seconded the motion. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Resolution granted to Frank Russell to attend N. Y. S. personnel and Guidance Assoc. conference at the Concord, October 20-21-22. William Walker moved and Carl Atwell seconded, passed by 4 votes of yes.

Francis Horan moved and Carl Atwell seconded that the Spanish Club be permitted to take a trip to Mexico either April 11-12 or the last week in June. This also will be organized by Miss Russell and Miss Goodrich. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

The past two weeks have been extremely hectic for me and as a result, I have not been as prompt with the column as I should have been. Please accept my apologies.

The foundation for the sub-station has been poured and back-filled, and is currently awaiting final inspection by our Electrical Engineer. Drive past the sub-station and observe the work.

I received a letter from Chairman Harland Hale stating that the Allegany County Board of Legislators has determined "... that it is not feasible, at this time, to establish a county-wide landfill system. ... Fortunately, our situation with Wellsville Landfill is solid. As I had mentioned before consideration is being given to the possibility of expanding the present capacity of the landfill, and the recent position by the Board of Legislators will probably hasten this action.

Mr. Ray Zimmerman from Goodkind & Odea Incorporated met informally with the Board members on Thursday evening. He stated that he will be beginning his study immediately of the streams and their impact on the community during the Flood of '72. He will be approaching some homes with questions concerning the severity of water damage. If you have any unique situations that occurred during the flood, please place them on a piece of paper and leave it at the Village Office for Mr. Zimmerman's investigation. He will be most pleased with the assistance.

Village Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees was held in the Village Office Sept 10, 1975 at 7:30. Those present: J. Michael Brace, Mayor; Harold Rice Robert Baker, Paul Hyland and Avery Mead, Trustees; David Dorance and Richard Booth of the Allegany Co. Health Dept., Mr. and Mrs. John Cannon and Brian Gabe Karolyi, Electrical engineer, and Harold Joyce, Building Inspector and Chris Blades from Allegany Birmens.

Minutes of the meeting held August 13th were read and approved on a motion made by Robert Baker and seconded by Harold Rice.

David Dorance and Richard Booth of the Allegany Co. Dept. of Health were present for a discussion of the problem on Water St. between Cannons and Monahans. Mr. and Mrs. Cannon have agreed to do everything possible to drain their property. A letter of recommendations for solving this problem was read and attached to the minutes of this meeting. Monahans will be notified by the Health Department as to what has to be done on their property.

Gabe Karolyi, electrical engineer was present to give a report on the progress of the sub-station. The Board will meet with Mr. Karolyi Saturday afternoon to finalize the location of the pad for the sub-station as the concrete will be done the week of September 15th.

Chris Blades of Allegany Birmens was present to explain the different materials available for the patching of streets. The surfacing of Barney St. will be started the week of September 15.

Communication was received from the Housing and Urban Development stating that the firm of Goodkind and O'Dea Inc., will conduct a flood elevation study for the Village of Andover. This study will develop technical information needed to establish actual insurance rates and provide a basis for the adoption of appropriate flood plain management measures. Included in the findings of the study will be flood frequency elevations for the areas of the community which have a special flood hazard. This study will last for 18 months and the community is urged to give support and information for this study.

Harold Joyce, building inspector was present to discuss the possibility of new building permits to conform to government regulations.

Moved by Avery Mead and seconded by Paul Hyland to accept the following Police Report for the month of August: Complaints 17; Investigations 17; Misc. Moved by Avery Mead and seconded by Paul Hyland to appoint Tom Feinling, Manley Baer and Martin Howland as crossing guards under the jurisdiction of the Police Department while on crossing duty.

It was decided to hold a special meeting Monday evening, Sept. 15, to review the budget for 8 months and decide what can be done to prevent the Grove and Little League Diamond from being vandalized as much damage has been done to the Diamond and new building.

Abstract No. 4 of 75/76 was audited and approved for payment in the following amounts: General \$2439.42, Water \$595.53 and Electric \$7865.60, and the special sub-station account in the amount of \$4,487.00.

This concluded the business and the meeting was adjourned.
