Ross J. Whiting, 86, of St. Petersburg, Florida and uncle of Douglas Whiting, Andover, died Wednesday, November 5, 1975 in the Veterans Administration Hospital, St. Petersburg, following a short illness.

Born in the town of Jasper, where he was engaged in farming, he worked for a time for the Steuben County Highway Department. He moved to Niagara Falls in 1941 and to Florida 28 years ago.

Mr. Whiting was a Veteran of World War I, a 60-year member of Robinson Lodge No. 895 F&AM of Jasper; the World War I Veterans Barracks No. 155; Pasadena Community Church; American Legion Post No. 14 in St. Petersburg and was a former member of the Canisteo American Legion.

Surviving are two sisters, Mrs. Leon Marlett of Jasper, Mrs. Viola Cavanaugh of Horseheads; and a brother, Elmer of Liberty, Pa.

The family received friends at the Smith and Son Funeral Home, Canisteo, where a Masonic Service was conducted at 6 p. m., Sunday.

Funeral services were held at the funeral home at 2 p. m., Monday with the Rev. Thomas Welch officiating. Burial was in the Jasper Cemetery.

School Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The monthly meeting of the Board of Education was called to order Monday, November 10, by the President, Mary K. Slade. Other Board members present were: William Walker, Francis Horan and Conner Stephens. Also present were Curville Jordan and Frank Russell.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read for approval. Motion to approve was made by Francis Horan, seconded by Wm. Walker. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

The Clerk's and District Treasurer's reports were read for approval. William Walker made the motion to approve the reports as read and Conner Stephens seconded the motion. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Payrolls for the month of October were read for approval. The amount of these was \$30,921.19. Conner Stephens made the motion and Francis Horan seconded. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Resolution was passed by 4 votes that the General Fund bills in the amount of \$30,138.42 for October, 1975 and Cafeteria \$2,867.81 as certified by Mr. Jordan be paid.

The motion was made by Conner Stephens that the president of the board be authorized to sign the School Tax Return consisting of unpaid taxes plus penalties. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

The Cafeteria report for the month of October was read showing a net loss of \$301.00 for the month. Francis Horan made the motion and Conner Stephens seconded that this report be filed with the minutes of this meeting. Interest only is due on Bus No. 31 on November 30, 1975. Conner Stephens made the motion and William Walker seconded that the sum of \$388.31 interest be paid. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Resolution was passed by 4 votes that the Bus Garage Warrant in the amount of \$174.20 be paid November 10, 1975. The motion was made by Conner Stephens and seconded by Francis Horan.

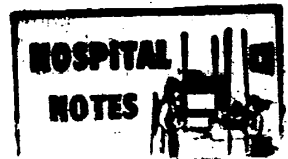
