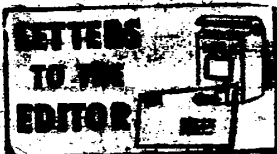

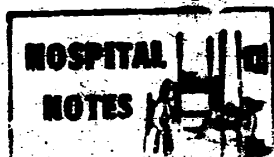
Mrs. Raymond F. Smith

Village Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the Village Board of Trustees was held in the Village Office, Wednesday evening, October 8, 1975. Those present: J. Michael Brace Mayor; Harold Rice, Paul Hyland Avery Mead and Robert Baker Trustees; and David Rossman, Acting Supt. of Public Works.

Minutes of the meeting held September 16 were read and approved on a motion made by Robert Baker and seconded by Harold Rice.

Minutes of the special meeting held September 15th were read and approved on a motion made by Avery Mead and seconded by Paul Hyland.

Minutes of a special meeting held September 29th were read and approved on a motion made by Paul Hyland and seconded by Robert Baker.

Mike Honerger was present to request the Board to consider a donation for the Allegany County S.P.C.A. This action was tabled until the next meeting to give the Board time to consult with our Attorney.

The report was given that the concrete work for the new sub station has been completed by Richard Boushie, and the back filling has been done and left to settle. The final payment of \$2,160 will be paid after the work has been inspected and approved by Gabe Kardyl, engineer.

The paving program on Barney St., has been completed with the exception of a problem created by the curbing on Barney St. Annex. Several solutions are being investigated.

A new building permit form was discussed and improvements suggested. This form will be finalized and submitted for Board approval at the next meeting.

The trash burning was discussed and as no reply has been received from Mr. Thompson, possible options and legal advice will be sought from the Village Attorney.

A proposal for all insurance protection and services was received from the Hyslip Insurance Agency. This action was tabled until the November meeting, and until the National Grange Mutual Ins. Agency has submitted a similar proposal.

A report was given on the projects of the Public Works Department by Dave Rossman, Acting Supt. Mr. Rossman was instructed by the Board to contact Harrison Ford and make arrangements for work to be done on the dump truck, and to also order wire for the electric department at a cost of \$505.00. The Barney Street bridge and needed repair was discussed. Mayor Brace will contact the Town and ask for co-operation in making said repairs. As personnel from Wellsville will not be attending this session of Water Treatment School, it was agreed to pay Dave Rossman .14 cents per mile for use of his car in attending said school.

A letter of appreciation from the Town of Alfred was received thanking the Village for its efforts on their behalf in the matter of Kenyon Road.

The Clerk was instructed to advertise in the Andover Wellsville and Hornell papers for a laborer for the Dept. of Public Works, preferably with electrical experience.

The Village Board will meet with the Town Board and the recreation committee on October 16 at 7 P. M. in the Town Hall.
