And, speaking of this great American tradition, we are happy to let you know that despite the higher predicted prices for Turkeys, our prices are lower than in most places in this area. Ellsworth, Butterrich Turkey of 18-22 lb., average are only 49c; with 14-18 lb. birds at 59c; and 8-14 lb. ones going for 65c a lb. Other meat specials include Red & White luncheon meats at \$1.09 a pound; Red & White Wieners at 79c for a 12-oz. pkg.; and Irish Brand Semi-boneless Hams at \$1.39 a lb. In the Produce Department, California Pascal Celery is a great buy at 39c a bunch; California Red Emperor Grapes are 29c a lb.; Ida Red Apples are 49c for a 3-lb. bag; Emerald Walnuts are 69c a lb.; and homegrown Acorn or Butternut Squash is 10c a pound. (There are the makings for a grape salad and your vegetable for that Thanksgiving Dinner.)

Grocery bargains include: Lake Shore Pumpkin at 35c for a 1-lb. 13-oz. can; Whip Topping at 49c for a 9.5-oz. pkg.; 7 Farms Ice Cream at 99c for a 16-oz. can; Red & White Cranberry Sauce at 29c for a 1-lb. can; Empress Pineapple at 49c for a 1-lb. can; and Hunt's Fruit Cocktail at 3-15-oz. cans for \$1.00.
