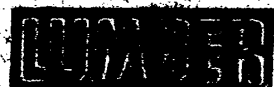

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN. That on October 31, 1975 the New York State Public Service Commission issued an order authorizing Iroquois Telephone Corporation approximately \$120,000 in additional annual Local Service Revenue.

These monies represent additional revenues, which the Commission found should have been applicable from 12/5/73 to 11/8/74. This results from a rate increase application of \$465,000 that the Commission denied. This application was filed in December of 1972.

The Company's appeal of that denial was reconsidered and reargued over the elapsed period. This appeal is still being argued and further amounts of restitution may be applicable.

The Commission authorized that the funds be obtained by means of a surcharge over a 12 month comparable period. Consequently, effective December 4, 1975, the Company will apply a 4.595% surcharge on all Local Service Billings.

A LOCAL LAW ESTABLISHING THE ANNUAL SALARIES OF CERTAIN COUNTY OFFICERS

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Legislators of the County of Allegany as follows:

Section 1. The annual salaries, none of which include any earned longevity increment, of the incumbents of the county officers herein set forth shall be the amount herein set forth opposite each such office, to wit:
