Notice To Harborers Or Owners Of Dogs

Dog Licenses are due on or be-fore January 1, 1976. They may be obtained at the Town Clerk's

be obtained at the Town Clerk's Office.

The law requires that dogs be licensed by January 1. Failure to obtain a license subjects the owner to a penalty of \$10.00 and costs and the dog is liable to seizure.

The Commissioner of Health has issued an order requiring all dogs six months of age or over in the County to be vaccinated to prevent rables. Therefore an applicant for a dog license must present to the Clerk a certificate certified by a duly licensed veterinarian showing that the dog has been so vaccinated. cinated.

To be acceptable, the certificate presented must show that modified live virus vaccine was used within four years immediately preceding the application date, or that killed vaccine of brain tissue or brain tissue origin was used within the control to the control to

If your application is mailed to the Clerk, the vaccination certificate must secompany your application and check. cation and check
