

Village Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the Village Board of Trustees was held in the Village Office, Monday evening, December 12, 1977 at 7:30. Present: Ralph A. Allen Mayor; Ann Appier, Karl Graves, Chuck Dain and Howard McAndrew, Trustees.

Moved by Karl Graves and seconded by Charles Dain to approve the minutes of the regular meeting held November 14th as read. Carried.

Moved by Howard McAndrew and seconded by Karl Graves to accept the minutes of the special meeting held December 5th as read. Carried.

A communication from Gowdy & Hunt engineers concerning the water system improvement project was read as follows:

Dear Mayor Allen:
Relative to our conversation of December 6, 1977, the engineering fee for the above noted project as of December 2, 1977 is \$5,555.00. There will be additional time involved in preconstruction meetings in preparation of documents and correspondence EDA before the inspection phase of the project starts. However, the entire \$7,000 engineering design fee should not be used and consequently should be some saving in that area.

As far as the \$6,000.00 inspection fee is concerned, we are dependent somewhat on how quickly the contractor completes the work as to how much inspection time will be involved with our firm. But there again, if we can keep the cost below the projected figure, we will do so.

Walter R. Redmond

Walter R. Redmond, 78, of Andover, RD 2, died Sunday afternoon, January 1, 1978 at Jones Memorial Hospital in Wellsville, where he had been a patient for three days.

Mr. Redmond was born in the Town of Greenwood, where he lived most of his life. He attended school in Andover and was a graduate of the former Canisteo Academy, Alfred University and did graduate work in astronomy at Cornell University.

He was the principal of Greenwood High School for five years prior to centralization. He also taught Math and Science. He then was in the oil developing business in Warren County, Pa.

Mr. Redmond was the head of the astronomy section of the Hudson River Museum at Yonkers for 10 years. He gave lectures in astronomy at the Corning Glass Center and retired as an astronomer-lecturer and head of the planetarium at the State University College at Geneseo.

He wrote a song, along with John Anderson, entitled, "The Song of the Worlds" and also was writing a textbook entitled "The Geometry of the Universe."

He was a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Andover where he taught an adult Sunday School class for several years.

On June 12, 1976, he was presented with a citation for "distinction of character, personal achievement, community service and avocational pursuit having brought honor to himself and the alumni of Alfred University." The citation was presented by the Alumni Association of Alfred University.

He is survived by his wife, Marion Weir Redmond, whom he married Oct. 12, 1939; and several cousins.
