Walter R. Redmond, 78, of West Greenwood, died Sunday P.M. January 1, 1978 at Jones Memorial Hospital in Wellsville, where he had been a patient three days. He had been in declining health for several years.

He was born on the family farm in Greenwood, where he still lived and was the son of the late James and Sarah McBeth Redmond. He attended school in Andover and Canisteo and was a graduate of Greenwood Union School and Alfred University. He did graduate work in Astronomy at Cornell University. He was Principal of the Greenwood Union School five years just prior to the Centralization and taught Math and Science. He was in the oil developing business in Warren Co, Ca., associated with Jesse York.

Mr. Redmond was head of the Astronomy Section of the Hudson River Museum at Yonkers for ten years. He gave lectures in Astronomy at the Corning Glass Center several summer and retired as an Astronomy lecturer and head of the Planetarium at State University at Geneseo. He wrote a song using geometric chords with John Anderson at Yonkers, entitled "The Song Of The World". He was writing a textbook with nature illustrations titled "The Geometry of the Universe". He had the help of SUC at Geneseo and Alfred U and the work may be used as kits in schools.

He was a member of the Andover Presbyterian Church, where he taught at the Sunday School for 25 years. June 12, 1976 the Andover University Alumni Association presented him a citation for distinction of character, personal achievement, community service and avocational pursuit having brought honor to himself and the Alfred University Alumni.

He is survived by his wife, Marion Weir Redmond whom he married October 12, 1939 and cousins, Mr and Mrs. Daniel Redmond of West Greenwood.
