Due to the many complaints to the Town Dog Warden concerning dogs running foose in the Village of Andover, the Village Leash Law will be strictly enforced.

The Village Leash Law clearly states that NO dogs are allowed to ribi loose inside the Village limits, and, that ALL dogs must be under the direct control of the owner, tiel must be on a leash, or confined of restricted to the property, of the owner, tiel owner, the owner is subject to seizure by the Town Dog Warden, or any Police Officer, and the owner is subject to a \$25 fine for the FIRST OFFENSE. In addition to this the Dog Warden may also assess a "per diem" charge for food and lodging of the dog while the animal's owner is being located.
