Warning Notice !!

Due to the many complaints to the Town Dog Warden concerning dogs running loose in the Village of Andover, the Village Leash Law will be strictly enforced.

The Village Leash Law clearly states that NO dogs are allowed to run loose inside the Village limits, and that ALL dogs must be under the direct control of the owner. (ie) must be on a leash, or confined or restricted to the property of the owner.

Any dog running loose in the Village is subject to seizure by the Town Dog Warden, or any Police Officer, and the owner is subject to a \$25 fine for the FIRST OFFENSE. In addition to this the Dog Warden may also assess a "per diem" charge for food and lodging of the dog while the animal's owner is being located.

News Briefs Of Local Servicemen

Marine Corporal Duane A. Losey of Mr. and Mrs. Victor A. Losey of Route 2, Andover, NY has been designated a crew chief with the 2d Marine Aircraft Wing.

Crew chiefs are responsible for the flight readiness and pre-flight safety inspections of their individual aircraft. They are also responsible for supervision of loading and unloading of all passengers and cargo and for ensuring that all required maintenance is performed.

In order to achieve this designation, Losey was required to demonstrate the ability to perform all duties of a senior enlisted crew member aboard one of the squadron's CH-53 "Sea Stallion" transport helicopter.

Losey's squadron is homebased at the Marine Corps New River Helicopter Air Station, Jacksonville, N. C. He joined the Marine Corps in July 1976.
