THE SOLDIER OF CHRIST

The Apostle Paul in II Timothy 2:3-4 compared the Christian to a Soldier:

"They therefore endure hardness, as a good Soldier of Jesus Christ. No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a Soldier."

Like a Soldier, the Christian is involved in a battle; a constant battle of spiritual warfare against Satan. So the same qualities which would make any soldier strong in battle can be similarly applied to a Christian.

In the first place, a Soldier's service must be a Concentrated Service. Once a young man enlists in the Military he can no longer allow himself to become entangled and involved in the ordinary daily scheme of things. He cannot be concerned with the common, but often pleasant occupations in life. In a very real sense, his life is not his own; but he is first and primarily a Soldier.

The Christian must concentrate on his Christianity. We are not to become withdrawn or isolated from the world around us, but are to be so involved spiritually that none of our energies are expended without some reference to our Faith. As men in the business world, are just as important, as housewives in the neighborhood, you are to use whatever may be your normal duties to live out and demonstrate your Christianity.

Trust God to not lead you into any situation in which you will be unable to bear; but give yourself over anew to Jesus and His divine blessings will follow.

Finally, a Soldier is Conditioned to Loyalty. When a Roman Soldier joined the Army he took the "Sacramentum" which was an oath of loyalty to his Emperor. Certainly this loyalty to one's Country has to exist if a Soldier is to be worthy and respected, and of any use at all.

Well, the same is true for us as

soldiers of Jesus Christ. In order to be of any use at all to our Savior we must be loyal; loyal in the midst of the many changes which will take place in our life time. Hold the banner of the Cross high and rejoice in your spiritual heritage as a child of God!

We are soldiers in a very real battle of righteousness against sin; and without these qualities of a soldier we stand to lose the battle and fall back into sin. Remember, we cannot confront sin without relying in Him who defeated the power of it at Calvary!

As I look from my desk, these words found on a wall plaque are a prayer for each of us as Soldiers of Christ:

"Lord, help me to remember that nothing is going to happen to me today that You and I together can't handle."

LEGAL NOTICE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that, on January 23, 1978 Iroquois Telephone Corporation filed with the Public Service Commission certain tariff changes that are designed to produce an additional \$173,145 in increased annual Local Service Revenue. The proposed effective date is February 1, 1978.

In addition, a 5% reduction in Intrastate Toll rates will also take effect on February 1, 1978.

The Local Service increase and Intrastate Toll reduction are a result of the Commission decision in Case No. 27100 and No. 27089 involving the New York Telephone Company. The independent telephone companies of New York State were given the opportunity, in this order, to offset the amount of the overall reduction in Intrastate Toll Settlements.

The amount of the increase for Iroquois Telephone Corporation represents a 5.38% in all Local Service Rates, EXCLUDING EXTENSIONS. EXTENSION SERVICE IS EXEMPT FROM THIS INCREASE. The amount of each individual's increase will depend on the current volume of Intrastate Toll calls now made.

Also effective February 1, 1978 a discounted toll plan for residence and Centrex Dormitory customers is introduced. This plan is called DIAL-A-VISIT. DIAL-A-VISIT is an optional service. It permits customers to receive a discount of up to 50% on DDD Sent-Paid intrastate toll calls placed during certain hours. A \$6.00 minimum charge will apply each month.

The following examples will show how DIAL-A-VISIT discounts apply:

Total Charges for Qualified Toll Calls	50% Discount	Total Billable Charges
A. \$ 5.50	\$2.80	\$6.00 minimum
B. 18.00	9.00	9.00
C. 12.00	6.00	6.00
D. 11.00	5.50	6.00 minimum

Intrastate DDD Sent-Paid toll calls placed within the following time periods are included in the plan:

- Monday through Friday 5:00 P.M. to 8:00* A.M. the following day
- Saturday, Sunday and on the five toll holidays 8:00 A.M. to 8:00* A.M. the following day
- *Up to but not including

Toll calls placed at any other time (8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. weekdays) are billed standard toll rates.

All intrastate DDD calls made during the DIAL-A-VISIT hours are included in the plan.

Where a customer has more than one line billed on the same bill, usage on all lines is included in the one plan.

No service connection charges apply to DIAL-A-VISIT.

A one month minimum charge applies.

Copies of the proposed local service rates are available for public inspection at the Business Offices listed below, our Division Headquarters at 14 Classic Street, Sherburne, New York, or at the offices of the Public Service Commission, Albany, New York.
