Dear Friends: Dear Friends:

Do you think that we should give away the Panama Canal? Is it ours to give away? In 1968 we gave the Panamanian Republic 10,000,000 in gold for the sovereign rights in perpetuity plus annual payments of \$250,000 — now in the neighborhood of \$2,000,000. for the life of the treaty.

80 percent of our commercial ships can use this canal. It is essential for the shipment of Alaskan Oii.

We have kept the Panama Canal neutral through four wars with our troops there.
