UPGRADING THE TAP PROGRAM

During the past three years, the administration of TAP awards have been a nightmare for students their parents and the state's colleges Applications processing have been exceedingly slow, and TAF award payments have been delayed, thereby putting unnecessary financial pressures on students parents and colleges.

The administrative problems

parents and colleges.

The administrative problems still exist with students yet received their TAP awards for the 1977 fall semester which has already been completed.

To ocal with these problems, Assenbly Republicans under the leadership of Minority Leader Perry 5. Duryea have introduced legislat on: tor provide a more effective eligibility verification of TAP award applicants and to develop an evaluation program monitoring the state's response to eligible students who experience long delays and errors in the processing of their TAP grants.

The legislation introduced also calls for increases in the TAP award payment schedule, pringing the program in line with today's costs.

ne program in the with loday costs.

A \$60-million increase would be made over the next four years, with 'anding being partially offset by \$11.8 million already appropriated in the TAP budget a location and \$8 to \$10 million to be gained by tougher eligibility verification requirements.

Maxhaum awards to students at tending independent colleges and universities would be increased by as much as \$350, while awards to students attending the lower cost stale supported schools would be increased by a minimum of 20 per cept.

A provision of the legislation also would benefit students attending the State University system by phasing out the \$200 million manualed reduction in awards to upper division students.

Additionally, the SUNY Health Services Fee imposed last cert would be eliminated at a saving of \$2.3 million for students.

TAP award increases are long overdue. The costs of a college education are rising rapidly and students and their families need help to meet the added burdens.

The Tuition Assistance Program was designed to aid lower and niddle income families in providing their entidren with a college education and we must ensure that the program does not become in feetilve due to administrative errors on out of date award levels. due to administrative errors or
