OBEEDIENCE:

In the Bible we find many passages that try to help us improve ourselves, to live with ourselves and God better, easier, happier.

We find that Christ was obedient — I came to do the will of my Father, Christ was obedient to the death of the cross, if this cup can not pass away unless I drink it it will be done, etc. He gave His own example of obeying.

We also see in the Bible Christ telling us to obey — in the Lord's prayer — they will be done on earth as it is in heaven — keep all of my commandments, do all I have commanded you, etc.

Since Christ was obedient, then we as His followers, must obey and since He gave us His example of obeying (e.g. Mary and Joseph of following the rituals of the Jewish Religion, of going to church, of paying the temple tax of giving to God what belongs to God and of giving to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, etc.) then we as His true followers, must imitate His example.

God did not make us machines, robots, androids, computers, but human beings with an intellect that is to help us see that it does make good common sense to obey, that it is better to obey than to disobey.

Obedience leads to discipline, self-discipline, happiness, ease of work and progress in wisdom and age before God and men. It is a transformation of the heart and mind for the better and it is a good change.

But not all change is progress. Disobedience is a change but for the worse. It leads to untold miseries of heart and mind, unhappiness for young and old alike, chaos at home, in the school, in the parish, in the community, the factory everywhere. Disobedience makes people crabby apples, sour grapes, mouthy and they acquire a quiting-attitude in many phases of life and what do they gain out of it? They who spent a lot of time bragging and sounding their own trumpet live in a dreary world and have no time to do good.

Obedience is humility — honesty — admitting who we really are, not what we think we are. But disobedience is a big blown up balloon that sooner or later bursts into many pieces; a swell head that makes a person top-heavy and leads into personal downfalls.

St. Paul in his many writings tells us to be good athletes in the race of life. If we look at today's sports, why did some become great athletes in their field? Because they listened to the coach, the trainer, obeyed them and so disciplines themselves to do what is right, to do what they were told to do. But when even these greats tried to cut corners, began to mouth-off, disobey, then what happened to them? They found out the hard way that other teams were not willing to trade for them that they were benched, even dropped and just faded out into oblivion, into the past, and that someone else took their place. They learned the hard way that, even they are not the indispensable, sun, moon, star of the world they thought they were. And the same is true with the actors and actresses, and others, for this is real life.

Obedience is not always an easy virtue to practice. But it is a vital one for the good of all human beings in the home, in the school in the parish, in the community in the county, in the country, in the world, in the factory, in the store in the team, everywhere.

Our hearts will be restless until they rest in Him, only if we really try, everyday, to the best of our ability to do His thing, not ours. We can only do our thing in conjunction with others and with Him. So God help us one and all!

And Lord helps us all to imitate Your examples of obedience and to really try to obey Your precepts everywhere.
