

**Alfred Ag-Tech Offers Course For Parents**

A non-credit course designed for parents of young children will be offered Wednesday evenings beginning March 1 at Alfred State Agricultural and Technical College.

The course titled "The Home Experience: Help Your Child Be More Successful In School," will be taught by Mrs. Ada Cushman of Alfred, a teacher at Alfred-Almond Central School. She said the classes should be of particular value to parents of children in the three to seven year age group.

Classes are scheduled for five Wednesdays from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. in the business technologies building. Dates for the classes are March 1, 8, 15, and April 5, 12.

Mrs. Peg Rusinko of the Office of Continuing Education said cost of the course is \$7.50 for one parent or \$10 for both. Advance registration is now being accepted by her office but participants may also register on the first class night.

Mrs. Cushman said one objective of the course is to show parents that every experience of a child is a learning experience and that many learning activities are suitable for home implementation thru interaction of parents and their children.
