AGENCY: Federal Insurance Administration, HUD

ACTION: Proposed rule.

Technical information or comments are solicited on the proposed base (100-year) flood elevations listed below for selected locations in the Village of Andover Allegany County, New York.

These base (100-year) flood elevations are the basis for the flood plain management measures that the community is required to either adopt or show evidence of being already in effect in order to qualify or remain qualified for participation in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFTP).

# SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:

The Federal Insurance Administrator gives notice of the proposed determinations of base (100year) flood elevations for the Village of Andover Allegany County, New York in accordance with section 1363 to the National Flood Insurance Act of 1973 (Pub. L. 93-234), 87 Stat. 980, which added section 1363 to the National Flood Insurance Ast of 1968 (Title XIII of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968 (Pub. L. 90-448), 42 U.S.C. 4001-4128, and 24 CRF 1917.4(a).

These elevations, together with the flood plain management measures required by Section 1910. of the program regulations, are the minimum that are required. They should not be construed to mean the community must change any existing ordinances that are more stringent in their flood plain management requirements. The community may at any time enact stricter requirements on its own or pursuant to policies established by other Federal State, or regional entities. These proposed elevations will also be used to calculate the appropriate flood insurance premium rates for the proposed elevations. and their contents and for the second layer of insurance on existing buildings and their contents.
