The Apostle Paul tells us of our need for armor given to believers to use when fighting off the enemy Weapons. On of the most important as spoken in the scriptures, is the shield of faith. Why is it so valuable? What is it able to do?

First of all it means faith in God as Father, Jesus as Savior, and the Holy Spirit as guide. Faith especially in God's Promise — Abraham as we are told in Romans 4:3 was counted for his righteousness — Not because he was able to keep the law of God; but was due to his faith in God's promises

The second thing we discover is that fiery darts of the wicked as scripture points out, are aimed at disrupting ones faith in God's promises.
