

## Village Board Grievance Day & Regular Meeting

Grievance Day and the Regular monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees was held in the Village Office at 6 p. m., Tuesday, February 21st. Present: Ralph A. Allen Mayor; Ann Appier, Howard McAndrew, Charles Dain and Karl Graves, Trustees.

Minutes of the meeting held January 16th were read and approved on a motion made by Karl Graves and seconded by Charles Dain.

Supt. Barry Rohrabacher gave his report on the activities of the Village Crew for the month. The report is on file. He also reported that the Firemen had requested to use the Village Electric Truck to change the location of the Fire Siren. Howard McAndrew moved Ann Appier, seconded, that Ken Lehman, being a Village employee and donating his time, could handle the operation.

Moved by Karl Graves and seconded by Ann Appier, to hire Maynard Townner to fill the vacancy on the Village Crew, at an hourly rate of \$3.61 plus the benefits of retirement and insurance.

Moved by Howard McAndrew and seconded by Karl Graves, that any further removal of snow should be done by the judgement of Supt. Rohrabacher.

The Clerk reported that the Village has received \$1,124.00 from the State Anti-recession Fund. This will be transferred to snow removal and the Police Department to cover the deficit in these accounts.

Moved by Karl Graves and seconded by Charles Dain to accept the following Police Report for the month of January. Accidents 2, Assistance to other agencies 7, Burglary 0, Disorderly Conduct 2, Misc. Moved by Charles Dain and seconded by Ann Appier, to hire Melanie Sink as Police Matron at an hourly wage of \$3.61.

A communication was received from the Town of Andover requesting that the Village support their recommendation that the County take over the maintenance of Kenyon Road. Moved by Howard McAndrew and seconded by Karl Graves that the Village support the Town of Alfred in this request and letters sent to the proper authorities.

Moved by Charles Dain and seconded by Howard McAndrew for Andover to participate in the Allegany County employment and training program for the summer and for the Mayor to be authorized to sign the necessary documents.

Moved by Karl Graves and seconded by Howard McAndrew, for the Village to be the sponsoring group for the Allegany County Watershed Study with the Mayor being the person to contact.

Moved by Karl Graves and seconded by Howard McAndrew, for the Clerk and Deputy Clerk to attend a double entry bookkeeping school to be held in Bath in May. This school is conducted by the State.

Correspondence was received from the Allegany County Planning Board inviting communities to attend a meeting in Belmont on March 6th for the purpose of completing a joint application for HUD funding for water distribution and supply. Howard McAndrew moved, seconded by Ann Appier, for the Mayor to pursue this project.

Communication was received from the Andover Fire Co., requesting a meeting with the Village Board for discussion of the Fire Protection contract which expires in December of 1978.

Communication was received that the application for funds from the Office for the Aging has been approved in the amount of \$1200.

The Second Monthly Meeting was called to order at 1 PM, February 9, 1978 at the Town Hall in Andover, New York.

Those present: Howard Burdick, Supervisor; Harry Kemp, Justice; Erwin Lewis, Councilman; Merle Dibble, Councilman; James Haugh, Councilman; Edna Baker, Clerk to Sup't HWY and Gladys Fox, Clerk.

A motion by Merle Dibble, seconded by Harry Kemp, to accept the January 12, 1978 minutes as read. Carried.

Thomas Kent and Howard Morris were present with the concern over the quantity of snow that has accumulated on the roads. Making these roads one way and would like to have them widened before we have another snow storm. It was discussed the ways this could be done in the future. Snow fence to lessen the snow in the roads and to hire additional equipment to widen the roads. Thomas Kent offered to help anyway possible to clear these roads of snow.

Mr. John McGranaghan, Director of Real Property Tax Service Ag. was present to inform the Board as to the plans that Allegany County are making concerning 100% Valuation for the whole County. The Supervisor informed the Town Board of a letter from SPCA concerning the need of a Dog Shelter in Allegany County.

A motion by Merle Dibble and seconded by Erwin Lewis to accept James Haugh's letter of resignation for the Town Planning Board with regret. Carried.

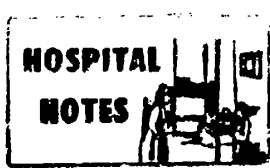
