Easter Sunday Morning we celebrate the central fact in all our human history, the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. The Resurrection of our Lord Jesus was supreme in its bearing on the history of the human race.

Most importantly, the Resurrection of Jesus Christ is the crucial test of the World's Redemption. The fact that Jesus rose from the dead is essential to the very foundation of Christianity for all of its claims are upheld by the one single fact. If Christ had not been raised from the dead, every bit of our faith would be useless and in vain.

But to the Glory of God, Jesus Christ died as He said; and He rose again from the grave just as He said He would. The gospel of Jesus Christ is true! There is no need for despair because there is redemption through His shed blood. The Cross of Calvary was followed by a Resurrection, and the gospel of Christ was confirmed — Because He Lives!

Be ever mindful that there is always victory through Christ Jesus by the working of His almighty Resurrection Power in and through us. This very same power which raised Him from the grave can be displayed in your life today as you surrender to His perfect will!

This is the meaning of the Resurrection: Because He lives. The gospel is confirmed with the provision of redemption from sin for all who believe! Because He Lives — we can have hope for a glorious everlasting future in Heaven! And Because He Lives — we can have victorious, fulfilling lives now by the power of the Resurrected Christ!
