Mary B. Stocum Resigns Nursing Service Position

Mary B. Stocum of Avoca has resigned as director of patient services of the Steuben County Public Nursing Service.

A veteran of more than 20 years in the public service nursing field Mrs. Stocum's resignation becomes effective March 31.

She will become public health administrator of the Genesee County Health Department, filling a vacancy there. She will start her new duties April 4.

As director of patient service for Steuben County, she has had supervisory responsibility over 59 employees, including 22 nurses, a 13-member clerical staff, plus therapists and home health aides. On her new post, she will supervise 29 staff members.

The Steuben County Board of Supervisors is expected on Monday to adopt a resolution appointing Loretta Kornuszko of Bath as acting director. She is the current supervising public health nurse.

A dinner honoring Mrs. Stocum was held at 6:30 p. m., Friday at the Ramada Inn.

A native of Andover, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Fay Brown, Mrs. Stocum, a graduate of Alfred University, Cum Laude, was the first of that school's nursing program to choose the field of Public Health Nursing.

Mrs. Stocum was among the six nurses forming the Steuben County Public Health Nursing Service when she joined it as a staff nurse in 1957.

She left after two years to fill a post of public health nurse in Virginia.

She returned to the Steuben Public Health Nurse Service in 1960 and left the county department again in 1964 to accept a district health nurse post for the State Department of Health. She covered Steuben County from the district office in Hornell.
