

School Board Holds Regular Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Education of Andover Central School, was called to order Monday evening, March 13, 1978, at 7:35 o'clock by President, Conner Stephens. The following members were present: Conner Stephens, Virginia Milligan, Paul McCormick, Richard Godown, Mary K. Slade arrived 7:55. Others present: Ethel Kelley, Frank Russell, Brenda Empson, Ralph Peterson, Karen Peterson, Sue Dugan, Mr. MacCrea, Mrs. MacCrea, and Sue Dougherty.

The minutes of the February 13, 1978, meeting were read for approval. Richard Godown made the motion and Paul McCormick seconded. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

The Clerk's and Treasurer's Reports were read for approval. Conner Stephens made the motion and Virginia Milligan seconded. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

The Cafeteria Report for the month of February was read for approval. Virginia Milligan made the motion that this be included in the minutes of this meeting. This showed a net profit of \$272.21 for the month. Richard Godown seconded the motion. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Motion was made by Conner Stephens that the Certified General Fund Warrant for \$3,912.63 plus utilities, be paid. Paul McCormick seconded. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Motion was made by Richard Godown and seconded by Virginia Milligan, that the Certified School Lunch Fund Warrant for \$2,090.76 be paid. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Virginia Milligan moved and Conner Stephens seconded that we pay interest due on Bus No. 30 on March 15th Amount \$82.33. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Virginia Milligan moved and Conner Stephens seconded that we pay interest of \$3,125.00 due on the Bus Garage. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Bids for the new Bus to be purchased after voter approval were read. The bid from Blovsky Sales for \$18,264.00 was accepted pending approval. Motion was made by Richard Godown and seconded by Conner Stephens. Passed by 4 votes of yes.

Bids for the sale of Bus No. 23 were read. The bid from Barden Bus Sales, Westfield, New York for \$577.00 was accepted. Motion made by Conner Stephens and seconded by Paul McCormick. Passed by 5 votes of yes. This sale is subject to the vote on a new bus at the Annual Meeting.

Warrant No. 3 — Federal CETA Grant — Insulation and Painting was read as certified for \$242.23. Virginia Milligan made the motion that these bills be paid. Paul McCormick seconded. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

CETA Grant No. 2 — \$249.24 on Boiler Room — Richard Godown made the motion and Paul McCormick seconded. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Virginia Milligan made the motion that the Board of Education of Andover Central School approve the participation of the Faculty and Staff of Andover Central School in the Allegany County Schools Federal Credit Union. Motion seconded by Paul McCormick. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Career Ed. Grant Warrant for \$75.50 was approved for payment. Conner Stephens made the motion and Paul McCormick seconded. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Resolution was passed to enforce Item 4 of rules governing athletes and cheerleaders. Stephens moved and Godown seconded. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

A dental and prescription program was presented on behalf of the Teachers Association and turned down by 5 votes.

Resolution — Board delegated to the Senior Class trip chaperones the necessary authority to conduct an educational experience. Mary K. Slade made the motion and Conner Stephens seconded. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

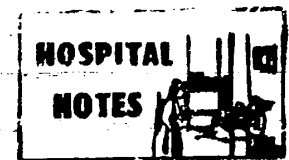
