

Village Board Holds Regular Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees was held in the Village Office, Monday, March 13, 1978 at 7:30 P.M. Present: Ralph A. Allen, Mayor; Ann Appier, Howard McAndrew, and Karl Graves, Trustees.

Minutes of the meeting held February 21, were read and approved on a motion made by Howard McAndrew, and seconded by Ann Appier.

The following resolution was moved by Howard McAndrew and seconded by Ann Appier:

Resolution by the Board of Trustees, Village of Andover, New York, at the regular monthly meeting held in the Village Office at 7:30 P. M., March 13, 1978

RESOLVED that the new residence of Frank Raykovitz is located within the Village of Andover near the south limit of the Village and that no distribution circuit of the Village exists within the vicinity of the new residence, the nearest existing distribution circuit being a distance in excess of 1000 ft. from the new residence, and further

RESOLVED that a distribution circuit of the Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation exists within the vicinity of the new residence passing within less than 300 ft. and further,

RESOLVED that Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation have agreed to furnish electric service to the new residence on behalf of the Village of Andover, via the existing distribution circuit in accordance with the terms and conditions of a borderline agreement dated November 1977, and further,

RESOLVED that such borderline agreement is approved and recommended by Utility Systems Corporation, Now therefore be it

RESOLVED that Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation be requested to furnish electric service to the new residence and that such borderline agreement be approved Supt. of Public Works Barry Rohrbacher gave his report for the month of February. This report is on file.

Mayor Allen reported that he has appointed Frank Cahill, Frank McCormick and Ann Appier to the Watershed Committee for the Village of Andover.

Howard McAndrew moved, seconded by Ann Appier, to place the usual Ad in the Maple Festival program for 1978.

Moved by Ann Appier, seconded by Howard McAndrew, to accept the following Police Report for the month of February: Accidents 1, Assistance to other Agencies 7, Burglary 1, Disorderly Conduct 2, Larceny 2, Misc. Village Board Hold Public Hearing

A public hearing was held in the Village Office, March 20th at 7:30 P. M., for the purpose of determining the community's desire to complete an application for HUD funding for water distribution and supply.

Present: Ralph A. Allen, Mayor; Ann Appier, Charles Dain, and Howard McAndrew, Trustees; Ken Roberts of STW, Ted DeVoe of Goudy and Hunt, Jim Hopkins of the Olean Times Herald and Steve Roeske and Joan Dain.

The Board was informed by Ken Roberts that HUD would prefer to have each Village submit individual applications for grants. Mr. DeVoe of Goudy and Hunt informed the Board that pre-application will have to be submitted before May 15th. A maximum of 6 grants at \$2,000,000 per grant for single purpose grants can be awarded.

The question was asked as to "how much the Village is talking about and what for." The Village would apply for a maximum of \$150,000 to complete the water line from 417 to Rochambeau Ave. The Village could then apply for another grant for spring development. The consensus of the attendants at the meeting was that Andover should file a pre-application.

News Briefs Of Local Servicemen

U. S. Forces, Germany (AHTNC) Specialist Four Timothy P. Hyland whose wife, Judy, lives on the East Valley Road, Andover, N. Y., recently participated with the 1st Armored Division in "Caroline Sword", a large-scale field training exercise in Germany.

Approximately 16,000 U. S. and German soldiers participated in the exercise, one of the largest maneuvers conducted by US Forces in Europe.

Spec. Hyland, a recovery specialist with the division in Katterbach, Germany, entered the Army in June 1975. He is a 1975 graduate of Andover Central School. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Paul K. Hyland live at 21 First Street.

Navy Hull Maintenance Technician Third Class Kenneth W. Geerson of Mr. and Mrs. Milton L. Geer of Rochambeau Ave., Andover, N. Y., recently returned from an extended deployment in the Mediterranean Sea. He is serving as a crewmember aboard the amphibious assault ship USS Guadalcanal homeported in Norfolk, Va. While deployed, his ship operated as a unit of the U. S. Sixth Fleet.

During the six-month cruise Guadalcanal participated in various training exercises, including the major NATO exercises "Display Determination" in Europe and the combined naval exercises "National Week XXIV" and "Sardinia 78" in the Mediterranean. Shipmates visited Italy, Spain and France. During deployment, Guadalcanal also participated in a search and rescue of five sailors stranded off the coast of Italy.

Guadalcanal is 592 feet long, displaces 18,300 tons and carries a crew of 528 officers and enlisted men. She is designed to transport assault forces for amphibious operations. She normally embarks a Marine battalion landing team and Marine helicopter squadron during a deployment.

Navy Lieutenant Commander Clifford L. Cornell, son of Margerete I. Cornell of Whitesville, N. Y., is on an extended training cruise in the South Atlantic. He is serving as aircraft intermediate maintenance department head of the amphibious assault ship USS Litchon homeported in Norfolk, Va.

This vessel visited the African countries of Gabon, Liberia, Senegal, Morocco and the Ivory Coast in early February, while assigned to a three-ship task group from the U. S. Atlantic Fleet. During the visit, crewmembers participated in numerous activities, including cultural exchanges, tours, athletic events and community assistance projects. Upon crossing the equator, those crewmembers going so far the first time were initiated into the "Ancient Order of the Deep" and given the title of "Trusty Shellback." During the deployment, Litchon will participate in routine sea operations and combined exercises with allied countries. Additional port visits also are scheduled in other African nations plus several South American & Caribbean port cities.

Litchon is 592 feet long, displaces 18,300 tons and carries a crew of 528 officers and enlisted men. She is designed to transport assault forces for amphibious operations and normally embarks a Marine battalion landing team and Marine helicopter squadron during deployment.

A 1970 graduate of New Hampshire College, Manchester, with a bachelor of science degree, Cornell joined the Navy in March 1953.
