**News Briefs Of Local Servicemen**

Navy Signal Seaman Mark L. McCormick, son of Mrs. Mabel McCormick of 22 Maple Street, Andover, N. Y., recently visited Chinhae, South Korea. He is serving as a crewmember aboard the guided missile cruiser USS Warden operating from Yokosuka, Japan. This ship's stop at Chinhae included four days of weapons, training and inspections. The visit ended a month of at-sea operations, providing support for the aircraft carriers Midway and Kitty Hawk and conducting training in engineering, casualty control, antisubmarine warfare and underway replenishment.

Warden is 533 feet long, displaces 7,800 tons and carries a crew of 396 officers and enlisted men. She is outfitted with guided missile launchers, torpedo tubes and an antisubmarine rocket launcher.

Hanau, Germany — 2nd Lt. Mark C. Wiley, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles A. Wiley, Greenwood N. Y., recently was assigned with the 6th Field Artillery in Hanau, Germany. Wiley graduated from the U.S. Military Academy, West Point, N. Y., in 1977.

Navy Lieutenant Commander Clifford L. Cornell, son of Margerete I. Cornell of Whitesville, N. Y., has returned after a three-month training and goodwill cruise in the South Atlantic.

He is an officer assigned to the amphibious assault ship USS Inchon, homeported in Norfolk, Va. While assigned to a three-ship task group from the U.S. Atlantic Fleet, Inchon participated in routine sea operations and combined exercises with allied countries. Shipmates visited the African countries of G. bon, Liberia, Senegal, Morocco and the Ivory Coast, plus the Brazilian ports of Salvador and Rio de Janeiro. Additionally, Inchon served as a support vessel during President Jimmy Carter's visit to Nigeria.

Inchon is 592 feet long, displaces 18,300 tons and carries a crew of 528 officers and enlisted men. She is designed to transport assault forces for amphibious operations and normally embarks a Marine battalion landing team and Marine helicopter squadron during deployment.

A 1970 graduate of New Hampshire College, Manchester, Cornell joined the Navy in March 1963.
