It pays to have a sense of proportion. Temperance and balance depend on it. If you don't have a sense of proportion, intemperance and imbalance will ruin your health and make you unwholesome mentally, morally, and spiritually. Alcohol and drug addicts bear this out. The daughter of the famous actor John Barrymore, Diane Barrymore, had a book written by an interviewer about her called "Too Much, Too Soon." Her father gave her too much of everything material too soon, including money and that spoiled her life for her, along with too much alcohol, so that she became an alcoholic. Shortly after the book was written she committed suicide. Not having a sense of proportion in her life destroyed her.

St. Paul had a sense of proportion. He put the proper evaluation on things in the spiritual life. He pointed out that love was the most important thing in the world. Love, he said, was of greater value than faith or prophecy or hope or knowledge or charity or healing or "speaking in tongues." In fact, said he, all these other things were of little value without love (I Cor. 13). You will notice how loveless people are who vaunt their faith or prophecy or knowledge or claim to "speaking in tongues." They cut themselves off from other Christians because they think they're better. They are spiritually unbalanced people when they do this.

Jesus didn't like the self-righteous people of his day - the Pharisees - because they didn't have a sense of proportion spiritually. For they boasted of abiding by such lesser matters as abiding by the law, and doing tithing, but Jesus said they didn't practice the greater or weightier spiritual matters, such as love and faith and justice and mercy (Mat. 23:23).

Our age overemphasizes the value of material things, and undervalues the spiritual things of life. Jesus said, "Seek first God's kingdom, and other things will come to you." We all need to have this wholesome sense of proportion.
