Ronald Kemp, Installer-Repair in for Iroquois Telephone Corporation at Alfred, New York, has completed a course in fundamentals of key telephone systems. The 15-day course was held at the Continental Telephone System Training Center near Amherst, Virginia. The course is a study of the circuitry, installation, wiring and repair of key telephone systems. (A key system is an electro-mechanical switching system into which a number of separate telephone lines can be connected. In this way, one operator can answer a number of incoming lines.)

Fundamentals of key systems puts particular emphasis on having the student install new key systems and rectify troubles it working key systems.
