"AND YE SHALL BE"
Have you ever thought to yourself what some of the possibilities are if we just listen to the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and let it lead our lives? Let us look to two or three and see what they are. In Acts 1:8 We are told that the Holy Spirit enables us to be witnesses for our faith where ever we are. "And Ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in Judea, and in Samaria, and unto the utter most parts of the world" Meaning, of course, God gives many, the talent of learning a foreign or different language from that which they grew up learning and speaking.

The second thing one might see is that men have been given strength in time of martyrdom. In Acts seven verse fifty-five, we find, "But he being full of the Holy Ghost looked up steadfast into heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing on the right hand of God." Stephen being stoned to death, not only was he unafraid to die, but he was happy in it, for he was dying for the gospels sake. They tell us that the apostle James was to be slain under the law because of his preaching and because their rulers were able to find a false witness to prove him guilty. The important thing is that the man who came as the false witness, saw James in such a state of peace, was overcome and came forth and admitted his lie, and so was able to be slain the same as the one whom he had accused falsely.

The third thing we might see is that through the power of the Holy Spirit many healings can come about. In Acts Nine, Seventeen, we read, and Ananias went his way and entered into the house and putting his hand on him said "Brother Saul, The Lord even Jesus hath appeared unto thee in a way as thou camest, hath sent me that thou mayest receive thy sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit."

Doctors may perform operations, they may prescribe drugs for us to use, but when we come down to the bare facts as Paul has said. When he started his work he was doing, He laid the seed, Apollous waters it but it is God who gives the increase. May we think of it in much the same manner concerning healing. No doctor actually heals, no medicine actually is able to heal. It is still in the hands of God and in the hands of the Holy Spirit. They are merely the tools which God uses.

We hope these few words have been of help to you. There are many other powers of the Holy Spirit, which you can look up in the Bible. For your self. For there are many.
