Stanley Lundine To Speak At Senior Citizens Conference June 24

Congressman Stanley Lundine (D-Jamestown) will be among the speakers at a senior citizens conference Saturday, June 24, at the Cameo Restaurant in Wellsville.

Lundine will discuss "Senior Citizens and Political Action" during the luncheon portion of the day-long program, which is co-sponsored by the Allegany County Office for the Aging and the School of Allied Health Technologies at Alfred State Agricultural and Technical College.

Mrs. Karen Bond, director of extended health education for the college, said the program is limited to 100 participants and that a registration deadline of June 17 has been set.

The morning session opens with registration at 10 a. m., and the first presentation, at 10:45 a. m., will be by Linda Hedden, sociologist and coordinator for research and development at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Bath.

Two workshops are scheduled prior to the luncheon and these will then be repeated during the afternoon.

One workshop session offered by Dana Slocum, chairman of the Food Service Department at the college's School of Vocational Studies in Wellsville, is titled "Planning and Preparing Meals for One or Two People."

The other workshop on "You and Your Health" will be presented by Dr. William Coch of the Andover Medical Center.

Following the talk by Lundine and a repeat of the workshops, the program will conclude with a summary and evaluation.

Mrs. Bond said the registration fee of \$2 includes coffee, the luncheon, and materials. Additional information is available by contacting the sponsoring organizations.
