**Swimming Lessons For Youngsters And Adults Available**

Swimming lessons for area youngsters and adults will be available at Alfred again this summer when the Happy Valley Swim School opens for the 10th consecutive year.

The School, directed by Alfred State College swimming coach Greg Spradling, and his wife Laura, is scheduled for 4 weeks (July 3 to July 28) at the College indoor pool.

Spradling said that the past practice of extensive individualized instruction will continue, with a typical class consisting of only two students to each instructor.

Spradling also notes that all types of swimming lessons will be available.

The various categories of lessons include: non-swimmer; beginner; advanced beginner; intermediate (holds advanced beginners card); swimmer (holds intermediate card); advanced swimmer (holds swim card); basic & advanced lifesaving; and adult classes.

The 30-minute lessons will be taught five days per week, and swimmers have an opportunity to select their own time (between 9:30 a. m. and 11:30 a. m.) The \$45 cost per student is for the entire 4-week program.

Spradling says that in the past children as young as age two have been enrolled in the classes.
