Proposition Number One
Shall the sum of \$1,000 be appropriated to meet the expenditures for Equipment and the necessary tax therefor levied upon the taxable property of the school district?

Proposition Number Two
Shall the sum of \$15,500 be appropriated to meet the expenditures for Interscholastic Athletics and the necessary tax therefor levied upon the taxable property of the school district?

Proposition Number Three
Resolved, that an appropriation of \$43,372.00 be made for the school year 1978-79 to provide for the transportation of elementary and secondary students who live in areas for which transportation was provided in the school year 1977-78. (Personnel \$29,500.00, Equipment \$300.00, Contractual Expenses \$100.00, Supplies and expenses \$13,472.00).

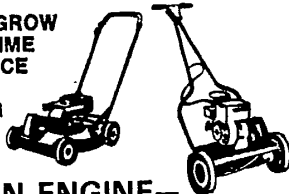
