



Town Board Holds Special Meeting

RESOLUTION FOR PURCHASE OF HEAVY MACHINERY TRAILER

At a Special Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Andover, Allegany County, N. Y., held at the Town Hall on Thursday May 25, 1978, called to order by Supervisor Howard Burdick at 7:30 P. M., with the following members present: Harry Kemp, James Haugh, Erwin Lewis and Howard Burdick. The following resolution was moved by James Haugh and seconded by Harry Kemp as follows:

WHEREAS, the heavy machinery trailer that the Town of Andover owns has become inoperative and unsafe and has deteriorated so it is unusable by the Town of Andover, Allegany County, N. Y. and

WHEREAS, there is a great need for the use of the purchase of a trailer for heavy machinery in order that the heavy machinery can be moved to various locations in the Town of Andover in order to repair the roads and highways that have deteriorated because of the ravages of winter, and

WHEREAS, it is imperative that the heavy machinery trailer be purchased at this time so that it can be used immediately as aforesaid, and

WHEREAS, it is impossible to wait for the publication of bids for a heavy machinery trailer, since the Town Highway employees and Superintendent must have it immediately in order to do their job in a workmanlike manner, and

WHEREAS, the Town Superintendent of Highways Max Baker recommends that a heavy machinery trailer be purchased immediately without competitive bids, and

WHEREAS, the Town Superintendent of Highways recommends that the Town of Andover purchase one Interstate Series 18TA heavy machinery trailer, capacity 36,000 pounds with proper equipment from the R. Wayne Fobes Inc. of Albion, Penna. for the sum of Eight Thousand One Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$8,170.00) and that the said sum of Eight thousand and one hundred seventy dollars (\$8,170.00) be paid by the Town of Andover when the said heavy machinery trailer is delivered to Andover, N. Y., and accepted by the Town of Andover and its Superintendent of Highways

NOW THEREFORE, in motion of James Haugh and seconded by Harry Kemp as aforesaid, the Town of Andover hereby agrees to purchase the said Series 18TA heavy machinery trailer with a capacity of 36,000 pounds with the proper equipment from the R. Wayne Fobes Inc., of Albion, Penna. for Eight thousand one hundred seventy dollars (\$8,170.00) and because of the emergency set forth above, it is hereby resolved that there is no need for the taking of bids on the said purchase of the said heavy machinery trailer with proper equipment and the said Max Baker, Town Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Andover, Allegany County, N. Y., is hereby authorized to purchase the said heavy machinery trailer for Eight thousand one hundred seventy dollars (\$8,170.00), from R. Wayne Fobes Inc. and Howard Burdick, the Supervisor is hereby authorized to pay for the said heavy machinery trailer in the amount of Eight thousand one hundred seventy dollars (\$8,170.00) when the said heavy machinery trailer is delivered to the Town of Andover and accepted by the Town of Andover and its Superintendent of Highways.

The above resolution having been put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

The resolution was therefore declared adopted to take effect immediately.
