**Tractor Pull To Be Held Sunday, July 23 At**

The 1978 tractor pull at the Angelica County Fair Grounds in Angelica, will take place this coming Sunday, July 23, starting at 1:00 p. m.

Between 60 and 75 tractors will compete for \$4,400 in prize money. Prize money is up this year, with first place winners in the Modified and Super Stock classes getting \$190, the same amount as awarded in the State Association's pulls.

The Angelica pull is sanctioned by the Western New York Tractor Pullers' Association and is run according to the rules of that organization.

Competitions will be in the 5,000 lb., 7,000 lb., 9,000 lb., 12,000

lb., and 15,000 lb. classes. More emphasis will be placed this year on Super-Stock and Modified classes, with the 12,000 and 15,000 lb. classes featuring only Super-Stocks.

The program will run for 4 to 4½ hours beginning at 1:00 p. m. then take a break until it reconvenes at about 7:00 p. m., for the evening portion. The evening session will probably run to 10:30 or later.
