THE MANY FACES OF FAITH

Like love, faith is a many-splendored thing. It has many faces, and to reduce it to only one of its aspects is to do it an injustice. Of course there is bad faith, too, practiced by many so-called Christians. Jesus warned against having such a bogus faith in his temptation experience. The devil asked him to cast himself down from the pinnacle of the temple, for said he, God will keep His promise, if you are son of God, of giving His angels charge over you, lest you dash yourself against the stones below. Jesus replied "You shall not make trial of the Lord your God." (Matt. 4:7). The faith that puts God to the test is a devilish temptation, according to Jesus.

There is the faith based on love that the Roman Centurion had when he asked Jesus to cure his slave. "Only say the word," said he, "and he will be healed." A delegation of Jews told Jesus that the Centurion was worthy of naming him do this favor for him, because "he loves our nation, and he built us our synagogue." Jesus exclaimed, "Not in all Israel have I found such a faith!" (Luke 7:9). A faith without love is nothing, said St. Paul, but a faith with love is the greatest, because it brings peace to warring parties.

There is the faith that endures to the end in the times of trouble. Such a faith helps make you stand up under persecutions and hardships, trusting in the Lord, and makes you "stand up, stand up for Jesus" no matter what comes, which Jesus recommended in Matthew 13:9-13. A fair weather faith is no good. There is the faith of the woman who touched Jesus in the crowd and got healed of her 12 year affliction, a faith that moves mountains born of serving the Lord and doing His will and purposes that Jesus talked about in Luke 17:1-10. There is the faith that has "hands and feet," the kind that does things for God and man.

There is the faith that adventures, the kind that Abraham had when he obeyed God and "went out, not knowing where he was to go, a fearless faith." (Heb. 11)
