Rev. R. J. MacCumber Andover First Baptist Church "JESUS LEADS THE WAY"

Reading through one of the famous missionary journeys that the Apostle Paul was noted for having made is spoken of in the first ten verses of the book of Acts the sixteenth chapter.

We see a great lesson especially in the sixth — the nineth verses, where Paul speaks of divine guid-ance given to a great servant of

And what is this lesson? It is the lesson of the different types the divine guidance God is able to the contract.

of divine guidance God is able to direct.

The first part of this lesson is, that divine guidance can be negative as well as positive. Paul was going North and South, and God suddenly said no, and sent him in another direction. Instead of going to his usual familiar jewish area, he was sent to preach to heathen, highly educated Europe who's people felt they had all they needed, and Paul was to prove to them otherwise.

Secondly the Guidance of God to Paul was general, directing Paul in a direction, without giving him specific destination in mind. We read another incident, in the scriptures, much the same as the guidance that was given to Paul, where God directed and took Abraham out of Sodom and sent him out as the prophet, Abraham, not knowing where he was going.

The third type we see spoken of here, is it was a specific guidance. Verse nine tells us that Paul could have been in a trance, or it may have been a prophetic dream. The fact points out, that Paul heard a call of a man from northern Greece, in an area called Macedonia "Come and Help Us!" He wanted Paul to bring the gospel to them, as they needed, it just as much as did the people whom he had been chosen, and in the practice of ministering to. There are other such past incidents, in scripture, where men were led by God.

Philip was led by God to go to the desert of Gasa, where he was called to preach to an Ethiopean, assistant to the queen and whom he was able to lead to the Lord.

And there was Peter, whom God called to speak to a Roman by the name Corneilous who's whole family became Christians after Peter's visit to them.

In these lessons we see divine guidance, even the it may seem negative can prove a real blessing. General guidance calls for more faith on our part, and specific guidance is so much better, because it points us in the direction, which God wants us to go. What direction are you Going?
