The Treasurer's Report for the month of June were read for comparison with the Clerk's Report. Motion was made to accept these Reports by Paul McCormick, seconded by Conner Stephens. Passed by 5 votes of yes. Reports for July also read and approved by same motion.

Motion was made by Virginia Milligan to adopt the 1978-79 Free and Reduced Lunch program as presented. Seconded by Paul McCormick. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Motion was made by Conner Stephens to accept the Bread and Bread products bid from Strohmans Bakery Motion seconded by Paul McCormick. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Motion made by Virginia Milligan to accept the Ice Cream bid from Perry's Ice Cream Co. Motion seconded by Richard Godown. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Motion made by Paul McCormick to accept the Milk bid from Elmhurst Dairy. Motion seconded by Richard Godown. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Cafeteria Report for the month of June 1978 was read for approval. Report showed a net loss of \$292.20 for the month. Motion made by Conner Stephens to file the report with the minutes. Seconded by Virginia Milligan. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Motion made by Conner Stephens to approve Non-Teaching Salaries for 1978-79. Motion seconded by Richard Godown. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Motion made by Richard Godown to approve the Teaching Salaries for 1978-79. Motion seconded by Virginia Milligan. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Motion made by Conner Stephens to accept the bid of Paul Ordway for \$25.00 for the snow plow. Motion seconded by Conner Stephens. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Motion made by Virginia Milligan and seconded by Richard Godown, that Principal — \$1,372.20 and Interest — \$82.33 due on Bus No. 30 be paid. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

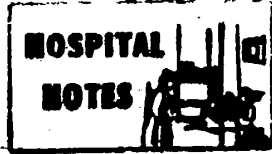

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees was held in the Village Office, Monday, August 14th at 7:30. Present: Ralph A. Allen, Mayor; Howard McAndrew, Karl Graves, Ann Appier and Charles Dain, Trustees.

Minutes of the meeting held July 17th were read and approved on a motion made by Karl Graves and seconded by Ann Appier.

Communications were read and acknowledged from Charlotte Cagle, Tom Smith, State of New York Department of Transportation and Utility Systems Inc.

Notice was received from the Erie Lackawanna Railway Company that lease No. 10872 with the Village of Andover will be increased from \$43.00 to \$75.00 for the coming year.

Correspondence was received from Goudy & Hunt informing the Village that the Department of Housing and Urban Development area office in Buffalo has indicated that communities will be contacted as to the status of their pre-applications between August 15th and 31st. Hud has received 300 applications and has money to fund 30. For those fortunate to be invited to submit final applications, there will be one month to do so. Therefore work must begin immediately upon receiving notice.

Mayor Allen gave a report on a meeting of the Supervisors and Mayors Association of Allegany County, which he attended July 27th. This meeting was to discuss the Court ruling pertaining to 100% valuation in Allegany County. The next meeting of this group will be held on August 24th.
