SOME MISTAKES TO AVOID

The mistakes men make are many. Those that count ought to be repented of, because they bring us trouble, as Jesus pointed out in Luke 13:1-5. Some people made the mistake of telling him that the reason why Pilate massacred those who were worshipping in the Temple was that God was using Pilate to punish them for their sins. This attitude of self-righteousness Jesus condemned by saying "Unless you repent, you shall likewise perish." We were pointing out, that if the Jews as a nation did not repent of their mistaken notion that they were "the chosen people," their self-righteousness and hatred of the Gentiles would destroy them. They did not repent, and they were destroyed as a nation in 70 A.D. by the Romans. Pride is a mistake because it brings strife.

Another basic mistake to repent of is that of giving too much credit to those you like, and too little credit to those you dislike. Jesus said that we should even love our enemies (Matthew 5:44). We gave too little credit to the Russians when in the 1950's we said they were a backward people and that it would take a long time for them to catch up with us, especially scientifically, but they proved us wrong when they sent "Sputnik" into the air, and proved their scientific superiority over us.

We should avoid and repent of making the mistake of making false ties or connections with reference to other people. The John Birch Society made this sinful mistake by calling former President Eisenhower a Communist because he declared that Marshal Zhukov, chief general of the Russian armies, was a friend of his. Former Senator Joseph McCarthy, head of the un-American activities organization, accused falsely the head Bishop of the Methodist Church, Bishop Oxnham, of being a Communist because he was socially inclined.

We should beware of making the mistake of reducing Religion to one of its aspects — faith, or love, or doing good. Religion is much more than any of those.
