**Missionary Convention At Alliance Church**

Rev. and Mrs. W. Henry Holton a veteran missionary couple who have experienced the revolutionary upheavals in China and other Far East nations, are expected to be here September 21 - 24, for the annual missionary conference of the Christian and Missionary Alliance Church, located at Rochambeau Avenue, Andover.

The public is invited to attend all session, Thursday through Saturday evenings at 7:30 p. m., and at 11 a. m., and 7:30 p. m., Sunday September 24.

Forced to leave China in 1949 when the Communists took over, Mr. and Mrs. Holton continued work with Chinese people in Viet Nam and later Cambodia. From 1961 to 1963 Mr. Holton served as pastor of the International Church in Phnom Penh. The Holtons were asked to join the faculty of the Alliance Bible Seminary in Hong Kong, where they taught for 11 years. Mr. Holton was field chairman and later president of the Seminary.

Rev. Milton Brown and his wife Patricia, have been parents to several hundred children. Missionaries to Ecuador, they have acted as dormitory parents at the famed Alliance Academy in Quito, Ecuador, where missionaries leave their children while they minister in the jungles and urban centers of South America. Mr. Brown is also expected September 21 - 24, to speak at the Christian and Missionary Alliance Church here in Andover. The public is invited to attend all sessions daily at 7:30 p. m., and at 11 a. m and 7:30 p. m. Sunday, September 24.

Mr. Brown, with the Christian and Missionary Alliance in Ecuador since 1963, will speak about the Alliance work in Ecuador where he has also been a missionary advisor in national churches. Of great personal satisfaction to him and his wife, have been their years meeting the needs of missionaries' children. He says, "We praise the Lord for the joys in have a part in the development of their lives."

Born in Cleveland, Ohio, Mr Brown is a graduate of Toccoa Falls College, Toccoa Falls, Georgia. After graduation, he pastored the Alliance Church in Jasper, Alabama, and then an Alliance

Church in Latacunga, Ecuador. The Christian and Missionary Alliance is an evangelical denomination with over 8,000 churches in 46 countries and with an overseas missionary staff of 938 missionaries.
