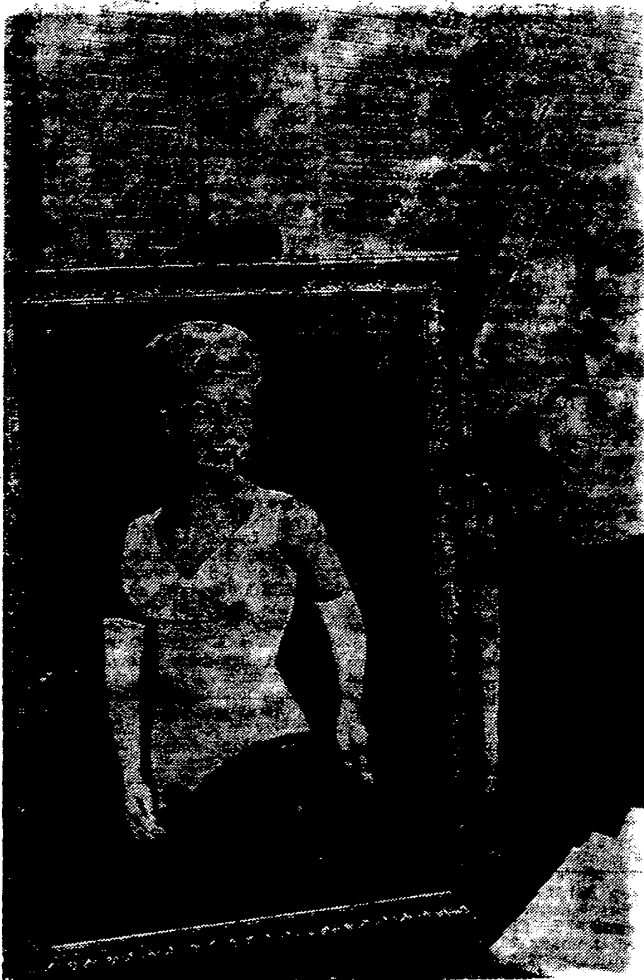

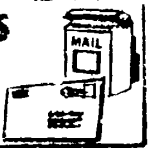

According to Mr. McAndrews Carol Hollenbeck's Portrait Photo appeared first in the Palm Beach Newspaper and was reprinted in Boca Raton News, Miami Herald and others.

Dr. McAndrews said in his note to us that William "Bill" Starke, 71 the famous portrait painter, is a neighbor of his in Boca Raton, Fla. and enclosed the feature story written by Will Lang, a Staff Writer for the "Times".

According to the feature story Mr. Starke has painted portraits of Winston Churchill, Lyndon Johnson, Dwight Eisenhower, Mrs. William Randolph Hearst, Jr., and Dean Acheson.

The Artist spent his childhood days in Lawrenceville, Va., in a town in which his family settled in 1830. He attended Concoran William & Mary University, and studied in Paris.

After leaving school, Starke op-

erated studios up and down the East Coast, was a Combat Photographer during World War II, and for six years, until his retirement in 1976, was a scientific and technical illustrator at the Pentagon in Washington, where he illustrated pamphlets for the Air Force.

"While at the Pentagon, I painted three Major Generals, along with President Johnson and President Kennedy with Mrs. Kennedy," Starke said.

Despite suffering a stroke in February, he is still active and will paint a portrait "if anybody wants it, but I don't advertise," he said.

Many people have done like Lloyd Hollenbeck of upstate New York did several months ago. "He commissioned me and paid me before I did the painting of his wife," Starke said. That painting is finished and waiting for Hollenbeck to come for it.
