A motion by Harry Kemp and seconded by Erwin Lewis, to appoint Alvin Hoover as Custodian of the Voting Machines for the remainder of the year 1978.

A motion by James Haugh and seconded by Harry Kemp to appoint Harley Glover as Dog Enumerator for the year 1978. Carried.

Max Baker, Supt. of Highways informed the Town Board that they will be sealing the Old State Road.

The Town Board decided to have a Special Meeting on Monday, September 25, 1978 at 7:00 PM for a Public Hearing on Revenue Sharing for 1979. The Town Clerk was instructed to enter a Notice in The Andover News. And they will also work on the 1979 Budget.

A letter was read from the District Engineer of the Corps of Engineers, New York State District, New York that after inspection of the Andover Dam, on August 31, 1978.

Visual inspection of the Rock filled Crib Dam it revealed deterioration of wood planking on the upstream face of the Dam and loss of approximately 40% of the Stone Fill in the Center Portion of the Dam.

They consider the Dam as unsafe condition and requiring the following actions of the Town of Andover within 60 Days.

Removal of the Dam of repair of the wood planking and restoration of the rock fill.

We would like to give those who knew Eva in the community, an opportunity to give, toward this love gift for Eva, if they would care to.

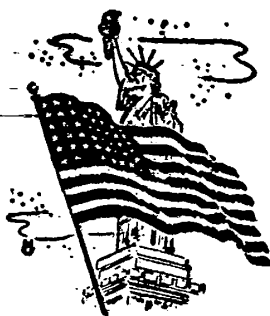
