**PEACE — SHALOM!**

Armistice Day, Nov. 11, 1918.  
11:00 A. M. — World War I officially came to an end.

That day the nations of Europe and some parts of Africa threw off the shackles of tyranny and foreign oppression and after many, long years of dehumanization, became free once more.

W.W. I saw systematic science (e. g. the machine gun, gas warfare, the airplane, tank, long-range precision shelling by new pieces of artillery, etc.) but to use to destroy large numbers of humanity. The 50 some nations that fought in that great war vowed that war would be no more. They pledged their sacred honors to never forget the ideals of the fallen dead and to work hard together to create from this day forward, THE permanent peace, that would end all suffering, anguish and degradation of mankind by mankind.

But what went wrong?  
1939 saw W.W. II, more global destructive, dehumanizing than before. Since that year we've seen Korea, VietNam, African genocides, global skirmishes, confrontations, revolutions, hot & cold flashes, Iron and Bamboo Curtains and even more clever science used to systematically and methodically eradicate millions more, all over the world.

And WHY?  
How long will it be before there is true peace on this whole earth? When will we learn the hard lessons of history? OR must we be made to live them in infamy all over again as the living DEAD?

If only we could stop wasting time talking nice ideas and started doing more good deeds in our daily living, as real God-created human beings, then we would achieve a real, lasting peace for all the children of Our Faather's world, with His help.

Oh, how I long for: 1) practical justice, the fair deal, the square deal, by all, not just for all — there are too many free-loaders in families, classrooms, churches, communities, the world who move only their lips but not their hearts, who seek only their rights but forget their mutual responsibilities.

2) living obedience and mutual responsive respect and concrete common sense among all peoples rather than clever rationalizations and subtle rationalisms of immature selfishness.

3) self-honesty of real humility and the de-masking of proud swelled-up egos who feel they are the world's greatest gifts to all mankind.

4) for inter-reliance, rather than just personalistic self-reliance, for we are all members of the same ocean of humanity — we need others more than they need us — for oceanic waves can throw us unto the beaches of isolation, and consequent absorption and disappearance.

5) concrete, practical wisdom that comes from serious reading, thinking, meditating and praying.

6) reinstatement of serious attitudes of mindful prayer where the words, Our Father, would concretely inter-connect and conalesce all of us, as members of His-family, with rights and responsibilities for all.

7) the peace of mind and peace of heart, the Shalom of Scripture that would arm the body and soul for good deeds, rather than just a nice day — so much I hope and pray for.

Many men and women since that day of 1914, the start of long global unrest, have given of themselves and even their lives, because they lived by and believed in noble, lofty ideals for a better tomorrow for all.

Let us restudy the ideas of history and live more concretely the ideals of Christ. He exemplified and taught also in His Sermon on the Mount, so that we may become really His divine family and work together for a better today, and tomorrow, of glory — here and hereafter!

May the Good Lord bless and keep thee and give thee peace. And may those who have been called by their Supreme Commander in Chief rest in peace. Amen Shalom! God bless us and help us all! And thank you, Veterans!
