Mr. James B. Wilmot, missionary to Pakistan, Indiana, will be guest speaker on Sunday morning, October 29, at the Greenwood and Andover United Methodist Churches during the regular 9:45 and 11 o'clock worship services.

Mr. Wilmot is one of seven missionaries interpreting the mission program of the United Methodist Church to the Olean District United Methodist Churches this week.

Mr. Wilmot graduated with a B.A. degree in business administration and went to Pakistan in 1960 as a 3-year short-termer to work in the Field Treasurer's office. There he married Miss Sadra Hancock who was also a short-termer teaching in the Trinity Girls' High School. They have now four children. He was appointed Field Treasurer or Financial Administrator there in 1966, and served in this capacity until July 1978 when he and his family returned for a one-year study leave.

Since 1972 Mr. Wilmot was also appointed as part-time Church World Service representative. As Field Treasurer he was responsible for the administration and financial relationships between the United Methodist Board of Global Ministries and the United Church of Pakistan as Church World Service representative. He was involved in flood relief and rural development projects and activities.
