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Village Board Holds Regular Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees was held in the Village Office, Monday, November 13th at 7:30 p. m. Present: Ralph A. Allen, Mayor; Karl Graves, Ann Appier, Charles Dain and Howard McAndrew, Trustees; R. J. Sootheran, James Gradgrath, and Supt. Barry Rothbauer.

Minutes of the October 9th meeting were read and approved on a motion by Karl Graves, seconded by Charles Dain.

The following resolution was offered by Howard McAndrew and seconded by Ann Appier as follows:

WHEREAS, the Village of Andover is the owner of certain property described as follows: ALL THAT TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND situated in the Village of Andover, Allegany County, N. Y. and being in Great Lot No. 88 in the second township of Range No. 7 of the Phelps and Gorman purchase, bounded and described as follows: On the East by a fence situated on the West line of the property of McAndrew & Sootheran; on the South by property of the Village of Andover; on the West by property of State of New York; and on the North by the highway known as Elm Street. It being the intent to convey here-with all of the premises described in a deed from Clifford O. Roy to Roy Courtney and Edith Courtney his wife as tenants by the entirety which deed is dated the 3rd day of December 1962, and recorded in Allegany County Clerk's Office on the 28th day of December 1962 in Liber 549 of Deeds at Page 303 except a small strip along the Easterly side of the above described premises which was retained by Edith Courtney.

Being the same premises described in a Quit Claim deed from Edith Courtney to the Village of Andover, which deed is dated November 8, 1965 and recorded in Allegany County Clerk's Office in Liber 568 of Deeds at page 810 on December 16, 1966.

SUBJECT: to all rights of way and easements as appear on record in the Allegany County Clerk's Office, and

WHEREAS, the Village of Andover had offered to convey the hereinbefore described premises to the Andover Fire Department Association, Inc. for the nominal sum of One Dollar (\$1.00), since the Village of Andover has no further use for the said property.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Village of Andover hereby conveys to the Andover Fire Department Association, Inc. the property described above on the payment of One Dollar (\$1.00), and

Ralph A. Allen, Mayor of the Village of Andover is hereby directed to sign all necessary papers including the deed to convey the hereinbefore described premises to the Andover Fire Department Association, Inc.

The above resolution being put to a vote, the vote was as follows: Howard McAndrew voting aye. Ann Appier voting aye. Karl Graves voting aye. Charles Dain voting aye. Ralph A. Allen voting aye. The resolution being adopted to take effect immediately.

The Monthly Report of the Superintendent was discussed and placed on file.

The Mayor announced that an equalization rate has gone from 22.53 to 19.22.

Applications for building permits were received from Theodore Sweet for a shed on his garage on

Church St.; from Claude Effie for a trailer on Rochambeau Ave.; and from Alan Folsom for an enclosed porch on his home on East Center St. Moved by Karl Graves, seconded by Ann Appier, to issue a permit to Alan Folsom and to return the same applications for more information and for approval by Harold Joyce, building inspector. Carried.

Moved by Charles Dain, seconded by Karl Graves, to authorize the Electric Department to borrow \$5,000 from the General Department to meet current expenses. Motion carried.

Moved by Charles Dain, seconded by Karl Graves, to transfer the Village Business Auto Policy to Hedman Agency, and to inquire into \$500,000 coverage. Carried.

Moved by Charles Dain, seconded by Ann Appier, to authorize the Mayor to get a binder on fire insurance and liability on the Electric Department tomorrow morning on the best price he can get. Motion carried.

The following resolution was offered by Trustee Howard McAndrew, and seconded by Trustee Charles Dain who moved its adoption:

WHEREAS the next General Village Election for Officers will be held on March 20, 1979, and

WHEREAS the Board of Trustees must designate by resolution and publish the Officers which are to be filled in such election and the terms thereof

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

Section 1. That the Board of Trustees designate the following officers as vacant at the end of the current official year to be filled at the Village Election to be held on March 20, 1979, for the following terms: Mayor 2 years to fill expiring term of Ralph A. Allen; Trustee 2 years to fill expiring term of Ann Appier; and Trustee 2 years to fill expiring term of Charles Dain.

Section 2. The Village Clerk is hereby directed to publish this resolution in full in the Andover News.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately. Carried. The following resolution has been made that the Village of Andover join with the Town of Andover and the Andover Central School District for a summer youth project.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village of Andover make application to the New York State Division for Youth for approval of this recreation project and the Mayor be authorized to sign all necessary papers of application. This resolution was adopted by the following votes: Graves, aye; Dain, aye; McAndrew, aye; Allen, aye.

Moved by Karl Graves and seconded by Howard McAndrew, to submit an application for funds to the Office For Aging for funds to be used for the Senior Citizens. Carried.

The following resolution was offered by Howard McAndrew, and seconded by Karl Graves, who moved its adoption:

WHEREAS the Village of Andover has on its books back taxes owing to the Village, and

WHEREAS for various reasons these taxes have been declared uncollectable

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this Board does recognize the fact that these are uncollectable and does approve a forgiveness of the following taxes:

Aden S. Horton, of R.D. 1 Whitesville, died Monday morning December 11, 1978 at Jones Memorial Hospital in Wellsville, after a long illness.

He was born in Campbell, N. Y. on April 2, 1902, a son of Theodore S. and Alice Harrison Horton. Mr. Horton was a retired employee of Air Preheater Company. He had previously been in the hotel and grocery store business in Whitesville for about 20 years.
